Re: P07 0682PF Education Improvement Project (Bangladesh)

On behalf of the Wild Rose Foundation Board of Directors, I am pleased to inform you that International Development Program funding has been approved for the above noted project in the amount of \$19,000 (Nineteen Thousand Dollars). This funding is awarded to assist with a project that aims to improve educational programs and learning environments at 10 schools in Bangladesh by way of providing improvements to laboratories, libraries and classroom facilities as well as providing student recognition of academic achievement. Funding is directed towards the purchase of library books and furnishings and laboratory equipment and materials for improvements. Your cheque is attached. (For NGO's outside of Alberta, your cheque will be sent to your Alberta Representative with the original copy of this letter).

TERMS OF THIS FUNDING:

- 1) This letter, your application, and your acceptance of the attached cheque form an Agreement between your organization and the Wild Rose Foundation.
- 2) By accepting this funding, it is understood that your organization agrees to the terms and conditions set out in the Policy Guidelines established for the Wild Rose Foundation International Development Program.
- 3) It is further agreed that the monies will be directed to this project as outlined in your application and that no portion of this funding can be rebated, paid or contributed to another Canadian organization.
- 4) Your organization, along with your overseas partner identified in your application agrees to take full responsibility for the ownership and management of this project with respect to funds provided.
- 5) Any changes to the approved project expenditures, to which this funding is directed, require the prior approval of the Wild Rose Foundation. Any significant delays or problems your organization encounters in meeting the objectives of this project must be brought to the attention of the Foundation in writing as soon as you are aware of them.
- 6) Any unexpended funds at project completion must be returned to the Wild Rose Foundation. There is no obligation by the Wild Rose Foundation to continue supporting this project after awarding this funding.
- 7) The Foundation requires all grant applicants to include a project plan following a logic model to reflect how the project will work to achieve results. Accordingly, the attached project plan was identified by your organization. As part of the accountability for this project you will be required to identify actual inputs, activities, outputs, outcomes and outcome indicators for your project upon completion.

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Terms of this funding continued...

- 8) The Foundation requires grant recipients to provide information that verifies that funding has been used for the approved purpose. This will be required as part of your accountability for the project. Where deemed necessary, your organization is to permit a representative of the Wild Rose Foundation or the Auditor General, or both, to examine any books or records to determine whether the funding has been expended as stated. What this means is because the Foundation must meet a specific target number of onsite reviews annually, your project may be selected for a site and/or project visitation either in Canada or the recipient country.
- 9) Please review this agreement with your Executive Director and/or Board of Directors. The Executive Director and/or Board members who signed the application are legally responsible for expending these funds as directed in this funding agreement.
- 10) Your organization is required to submit an Accountability Report within 6 (six) months of the completion of your project. The format for the required Accountability Report is attached for this purpose. **December 1, 2009** is the date we have established that your Accountability Report is due in our office. Please document this date so that you do not forget.

Public Recognition of Wild Rose Foundation Funding:

It is important that Albertans and Overseas Partners are made aware that funding for this project has been provided by contributions by Alberta citizens and matched by the Wild Rose Foundation. A condition of receiving this funding is that the Wild Rose Foundation is acknowledged through any form of public acknowledgment including annual reports, newsletters, press releases and/or correspondence with your Overseas Partner. Enclosed is a PMT you may wish to use in acknowledging the Wild Rose Foundation, our logos are also now available electronically on our website at www.wildrosefoundation.ca.

We want you to know that the Government of Alberta supports and appreciates the good work being carried out by your agency.
